I have had many partners on my spiritual journey. There are those with whom I have held hands, drank coffee, shed tears, and laughed heartily. Then, there are those who were friends "on the page" – theologians, pastors, and authors whose words were a balm, a guide, and an inspiration. One such friend was Frederick Buechner. I read his words daily. I quote him regularly. I seek his counsel when I do not have the right words. I open his books when I need comfort.

My partner for the journey, Frederick Buechner, died on August 15, 2022. I realize I shared him with thousands, if not millions of others around the world, and frankly, he had no idea I existed. There is still a small lonely space within me knowing this stranger will no longer be writing, will no longer be speaking truth into the world. His light remains, though. His words continue to serve as a guide. My feet, therefore, will continue moving ahead, because "where [my] feet take [me], that is who [1] am."

"The way I understood it," my grandmother says, "you were supposed to devote these talks to religious matters. Incarnation and Grace and Salvation were some of the noble words you used."

I say that feet are very religious too. She says that's what you think. I say that if you want to know who you are, if you are more than academically interested in that particular mystery, you could do a lot worse than look to your feet for an answer. Introspection in the long run doesn't get you very far because every time you draw back to look at yourself, you are seeing

everything except for the part that drew back, and when you draw back to look at the part that drew back to look at yourself, you see again everything except for what you are really looking for. And so on. Since the possibilities for drawing back seem to be infinite, you are, in your quest to see yourself whole, doomed always to see infinitely less than what there will always remain to see. Thus, when you wake up in the morning, called by God to be a self again, if you want to know who you are, watch your feet. Because where your feet take you, that is who you are.

This fall, BSF groups around the world will begin a new study of 1 & 2 Kings, 2 Chronicles, and several major and minor prophets. Classes meet weekly and follow a four-part method for each week's lesson: personal study at home, small-group discussion and an allclass lecture at a local church, with commentary notes to read at home. There are 30 lessons in each 8-month study.

WE CAN'T SEE LIGHT ITSELF.

We can see only what light lights up, like the little circle of night where the candle flickers—a sheen of mahogany, a wineglass, a face leaning toward us out of the shadows.

When Jesus says that he is the Light of the World (John 8:12), maybe something like that is part of what he is saying. He himself is beyond our seeing, but in the darkness where we stand, we see, thanks to him, something of the path that stretches out from the door, something of whatever it is that keeps us trying more or less to follow the path even when we can hardly believe that it goes anywhere worth going or that we have what it takes to go there, something of whoever it is that every once in a while seems to lean toward us out of the shadows.
