here was a gathering at the intersection of Johnson Street Longley and Avenue on the afternoon of Sunday, April 23, 2023. The gathering included people from that neighborhood, teachers and students from Jefferson Middle School, members of the wider South Bend community, and the family of 11 year-old Tyon Horston, who was shot and killed at that intersection Thursday evening. I arrived for the gathering a little early and watched as community leaders and neighbors set up tables, opened pizza boxes and packages of paper plates, handed out umbrellas, and, for what seemed like hours, just stood there, at that corner, looking at each other and the make-shift memorial that had been growing since Thursday. Eventually, someone spoke. Then more people spoke. There were heartfelt memories shared. There were pleas for help in preventing kids from dying like this anymore. There were political promises made. There was agonizing surrender to overwhelming emotions in the wake

of yet another loss of life. In the midst of all of that I heard one woman say, cry really, "Are we not our brother's keepers?"

I have come to the conclusion, after considering that question for a few days now, that yes, if we follow Jesus, we are our brother's and our sister's keepers; or, at least we should be. We follow the One who said, "Love one another as I have loved you," and "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you," and "Love your neighbor as you love yourself." And yet, another tragic loss of life has come and gone. It's almost as if it doesn't matter. But, we follow Jesus. This, and all loss of life, should matter to us. And I would even suggest, when it is a child whose life comes to a tragic end, like T'yon Horston's did, it should matter even more. At the risk of some taking this to an ugly place of politics and division, I want to say clearly, "The life of T'yon Horston matters!" Following Jesus is hard! Seeking justice is hard! Loving our neighbors as we love ourselves is hard! Finding solutions to the kinds of problems that result in the loss of 11 year old children in our city is hard! But we are our brother's and our sister's keepers, Church! The hard work is ours to do! I am ready to get started. Are you? I am ready to stand between the next child and the issues that threaten them. Are you?

SUNDAY SCHOOL EVENT ENJOYED BY ALL AGES
