

just returned from a week of vacation. I was attempting to be intentional about "unplugging" or "getting away" from the normal, everyday demands of being a pastor. So, last week I attempted to rest. To step away from what I do on a regular basis and just rest. I don't know about you but resting is not an easy thing for me. Resting is something that does not come naturally for me. Resting is something that I know I need to do often, but that I don't typically take the time to do. Skipping rest is not very healthy. It's not physically healthy; it's not mentally healthy; it's not emotionally healthy; and it's not professionally healthy either. We need rest to be the best we can be; to be and do what God intends. Rest is very important.

I believe we have evidence that Jesus took intentional rest periods too. I love the story Mark shared

in his gospel about Jesus taking, or attempting to take, a rest from the daily grind of his life. Mark 4:35-40 says, That day when evening came, he said to his disciples, "Let us go over to the other side." Leaving the crowd behind, they took him along, just as he was, in the boat. There were also other boats with him. A furious squall came up, and the waves broke over the boat, so that it was nearly swamped. Jesus was in the stern, sleeping on a cushion. The disciples woke him and said to him, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?" He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Quiet! Be still!" Then the wind died down and it was completely calm. He said to His disciples, "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?" I wonder if Jesus laid back down on His cushion and went back to sleep after that? I wonder if he went back to being intentional about resting because he knew how important it was? I think this is such a relevant passage when it comes to understanding the importance of intentional rest. Jesus saw the crowds of people with need. They needed healing. They needed demons cast out. They needed all of the things he could give them. But Jesus still got into the boat and got away. Jesus, even knowing there was a lot of important work to be done, got into a boat so that he could rest for a little while. I think he knew how much better he would be for them rested, than tired. Do you recognize that yourself? Do you know you need to rest? Do you know you need to unplug, step away from your normal life every now and then? I am learning that more and more as I go. I hope you are too. We are so much better for ourselves, for others and for God when we are rested. There will always be more to do.

Bible Study Fellowship is an indepth Bible study that meets mid-September - early May (with a long break in December). This fall, BSF groups around the world will begin a study of the gospel according to John. Classes meet weekly and follow a four-part format for each week's lesson: personal study at home, small-group discussion and an all-class lecture at a local church, followed by commentary notes to read at home.

Locally, there are both men's groups and women's groups, and

some include children's programs. (Daytime groups include a program for infants through preschool; evening groups include a K-12 program.) BSF offers inperson and virtual options.




