NO SMALL THING

Grace member Mary Garlathy came into the office and shared an idea with me. Mary is active with her United Methodist Women's (UMW) circle and felt God leading her to introduce a service project to the whole circle. The project is to put together 50 UMCOR Hygiene kits to be donated and eventually delivered, by UMCOR, to people who have experienced a disaster. Fifty hygiene kits might sound like drop in the bucket, but not if you ask one of the 50 people who will get one in what may be their time of greatest need. This project is no small thing! I am grateful to Mary for listening to God's still small voice, and going where he leads her.

UMCOR is one of my favorite things about being a United Methodist Christian. UMCOR stands for United Methodist Committee on Relief. UMCOR is oftentimes the first group in and the last group out following a natural or human-made disaster. But it's so important to know that UMCOR is us! UMCOR is United Methodist Christians willing to serve by praying, being on a disaster response team, donating items for flood clean-up buckets and hygiene

kits, and putting those things together.

UMCOR is us! When Mary Garlathy's UMW circle comes together to donate and assemble hygiene kits next month, they are UMCOR. I hope that is as exciting to you as it is to me.

I hope you will pray for Mary's UMW circle as they embark on this service project! I also hope you will pray for the men, women, boys and girls who will receive one of the kits in their time of need. And I hope you will pray for our Missions Committee and me as we take this great idea from Mary Garlathy, and introduce it to our whole church! Grace UMC has a history of supporting UMCOR in many ways, including donating hygiene kits. My hope is that we can revive that great work and get EVERYONE excited to be involved here again! This is a great and tangible opportunity for us to love our neighbors, and it is no small thing!

WELCOME, NICO!

The history of this church takes us from an organ as an unwanted item to an essential part of our worship and an outstanding music program. It has become more difficult to find someone to serve as the organist of this church.

In the last few years, we have been the recipients of a grant from Eli Lilly which was administered by the University of Notre Dame. This grant is no longer funded, and organists are generally not available. We have been in prayer for several months, asking God to give us direction and send us the person that we need. God has heard our pleas, and we are thankful that Nico Tjoelker will be our new Organist and Choir Director.

Nico is studying a Doctor of Musical Arts in organ at University of Notre Dame with Professor Kola Owolabi. He recently completed a Master of Music in organ at Yale University with Professor James O'Donnell, former organist and choirmaster of Westminster Abbey, London. At Yale, Nico served as Director of Music at Berkeley Divinity School. He was also the

senior organ scholar at Trinity
Episcopal Church on the Green in
New Haven, Connecticut, where
he served under Director of Music
Walden Moore and assisted in the
direction of the church's adult and
children's choirs.

Prior to Yale, Nico lived in Australia. In 2020, he completed a Bachelor of Music in organ at Sydney Conservatorium of Music, where he studied under Professor Philip Swanton. He graduated with First Class Honors, receiving high distinction on his thesis on the topic of early twentieth-century recordings of organ music on paper rolls. Nico previously served as organ scholar at two Sydney churches: St. Mark's Anglican Church (2020 - 2021) and St. Stephen's Uniting Church (2017 – 2021).

Nico enjoys studying and performing internationally. From 2018 – 2019, he completed a semester exchange at the Hochschule für Musik in Freiburg, Germany. He has twice attended the Haarlem International Organ Festival in the Netherlands (2018) and 2022), and was selected to be one of five participants in the Lucerne Organ Masterclass (Switzerland) in August 2018 under the direction of Wolfgang Sieber. Nico played for the Australia and New Zealand College of Organists Academy recital in Napier, New Zealand in 2018. In July 2017, he toured the historical organs of Europe with the Sydney Conservatorium organ department. In July 2016, Nico completed the Organ Scholar Experience course at Cambridge University, UK, and performed five recitals in an international organ recital tour in the UK and the Netherlands. In 2015 he was the quest organist for the New South Wales Youth Orchestra's inaugural concert. He was awarded first prize in the 2013 Sydney Organ Competition - Intermediate Section, and first prize in the 2016 Sydney Organ Competition - Open Section

Nico lives in South Bend with his wife Alice, who studies Liturgical Studies at Notre Dame.

UMCOR HYGIENE KITS

The United Methodist Women are working on a project for UMCOR to assemble 50 hygiene kits to be distributed worldwide to people who have lost their homes due to fires, floods, and war.

A hygiene kit includes these materials:

- ONE HAND TOWEL (15 x 25-17 x 27 inches) No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- ONE WASHCLOTH No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- ONE COMB

Must be sturdy with at least 4-7 inches of teeth No pocket combs or picks Rattail and combs without handles are acceptable but must have at least 4-7 inches of teeth

ONE TOENAIL OR FINGERNAIL CLIPPER

No emery boards or metal files

BATH-SIZED SOAP (3 oz. bar or larger) No Ivory or Jergen's bar soap

Do not remove from packaging

ONE ADULT TOOTHBRUSH

Do not remove from packaging Personal advertising not acceptable

- 10 ADHESIVE BANDAGES (3/4 by 3 inches) Common household bandages acceptable
- ONE ONE-GALLON SIZE RE-SEALABLE BAG

*Please do not add toothpaste when assembling kits. We are collecting the items needed during September and October and will assemble the kits at our November 2 UMW meeting as part of our World Thank Offering program. Check out the UMW bulletin board in the Welcome Center if you would like to help with this project by donating specific items of \$\$ to cover other costs.

Thank you to all who contributed desserts, fruit and/or condiments for the cookout that missions held at Motels4Now (a program that houses the chronically homeless and is helping many move into longterm housing arrangements).

We fed about 50 - 75 people that evening; leftovers were donated for future use at the facility. It was gratifying to help in this way and it wouldn't have been possible without the donated items.

Special thanks to those who helped onsite with the cooking, service and clean-up. We are blessed to have such a generous congregation!
